Opening Remarks

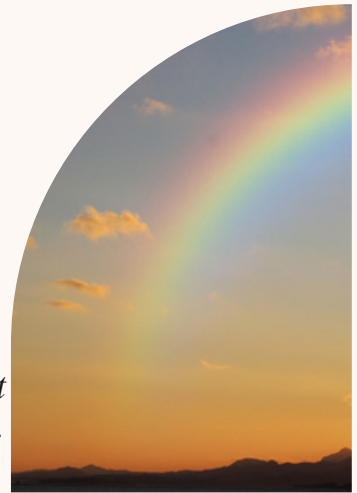
